

Sessional Instructor Openings – Fall 2017 and Winter 2018

The Faculty of Arts invites applications for a term certain *Sessional Instructor* positions within The School of Public Policy to teach:

1. PPOL 611.15 – Economic Regulation and Competition Policy- in the Master of Public Policy program. This course is scheduled for F2017 term (September 1, 2017 – December 31, 2017) on Thursdays from 9:00 am – 11:50 am.

PPOL 611.15 - students are introduced to intervention practices and policies by government with regard to the design and operation of markets. It covers the use of antitrust policies to limit the market power and the acquisition of market power as well as the use of economic regulation to limit the inefficient exercise of market power. Classes will be a combination of lectures and class discussions and there will be assignments.

2. PPOL 609 – Decision Analysis. This course is scheduled for W2018 term (January 1, 2018 – April 30, 2018) on Tuesdays from 5:00 pm – 7:50 pm.

PPOL 609 covers decision making in a complex environment influenced by a variety of factors including uncertainty, risk, different time frames, multiple objectives, interest group consensus and inconsistent time expectations among actors. Classes will be a combination of lectures, class discussions and there will be assignments.

Requirements

The successful candidate for each course must have a Ph.D. in Economics with specialization in Industrial Organization, Regulatory Economics and standard decision analysis tools such as Cost Benefit and Impact Analysis. Demonstrated evidence of teaching excellence in upper level economics courses (preferably in Microeconomics, Decision Theory and Public Finance) is required.
