The Faculty of Arts invites applications for a term certain *Sessional Instructor* position within The School of Public Policy to teach:

PPOL 619 – Governance, Institutions and Public Policy - in the Master of Public Policy program. This course is scheduled for the W2018 term (January 8, 2018 – April 26, 2018) on Tuesdays from 5 pm – 8 pm.

PPOL 619 – An examination of the roles and relationships among institutions that shape public policy outcomes. Institutional relationships and the evolution of those relationships are studied. The dynamics of multi-level governance and bureaucratic versus legislative public policymaking are explored in order to explain how policy is made both provincially and federally.

Requirements

The successful candidate must have a Ph.D. in Political Science or Public Administration with specialization in government, institutions and public policy development and implementation. Research and practical experience in these areas at the federal or provincial level is an asset. Demonstrated evidence of teaching excellence in upper level university courses (preferably in the area of government, institutions and policymaking) is required.
