Janice MacKinnon is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada, a member of the Order of Canada, and a former Saskatchewan Finance Minister. She has a PhD and M.A. from Queen's University and an Honours B.A. from the University of Western Ontario. She is the author of three books, The Liberty We Seek published by Harvard University Press, While the Women Only Wept and Minding the Public Purse and she has written many articles on public policy issues. She has also served as the Chair of the Board of the Institute for Research on Public Policy, a board member of the Canada West Foundation and is currently an advisor to the Eco-Fiscal Commission. Between 1991 and 2001 she was a cabinet minister in Saskatchewan and held various portfolios including Minister of Finance, Minister of Social Services, Minister of Economic Development, and Government House leader. During her tenure as Finance Minister, Saskatchewan became the first government in Canada to balance its budget in the 1990s. She is a Professor of Fiscal policy at the School of Public Health at the University of Saskatchewan and she provides commentary and analysis of Canadian fiscal issues, health policy and politics. She was a member of the National Task Force on Financial Literacy. She also served as Chair of Canada's Economic Advisory Council from 2010 to 2015. In 2013 she was chosen as one of Canada's top 25 Women of Influence.
