The Faculty of Arts invites applications for a term certain Sessional Instructor position within The School of Public Policy to teach:

PPOL 611.16 – Climate Change and Policy Making in Canada - in the Master of Public Policy program. This course is scheduled for the W2018 term (January 8, 2018 – April 26, 2018) on Mondays from 9:00 am – 11:50 am.

PPOL 611.16 - students are introduced to the political and governance aspects of climate change policy in Canada. Includes investigation of climate change policy instruments such as carbon pricing, regulations and voluntary measures, as well as the unique characteristics of climate change policy making in Canada. Case studies at the provincial and federal level are used. The course provides practical knowledge and skills useful for the design and implementation of climate change policy.

Requirements

The successful candidate must have a Ph.D. in Public Administration, Public Policy or Political Economy with specialization in climate change policy design and implementation. Research and practical experience in climate change policy at the provincial or federal level is an asset. Demonstrated evidence of teaching excellence in upper level university courses (preferably in Public Administration) is required.
