Dr. Myles Leslie, is the Director of Research at the School of Public Policy at the University of Calgary. He is a health services policy researcher with an appointment in the Cumming School of Medicine, Department of Community Health Sciences. His work focuses on applying the principles of engagement and involvement to real-world challenges in the policy and practice of healthcare. Dr. Leslie's primary substantive interest is in the policies and relationships of primary care specifically and quality improvement more broadly. His focus is on the technology, policy, organizational, and clinical level reforms that are needed to support the delivery of high quality, high value care to a broad range of Canadians. He brings extensive international experience in ethnography and related qualitative methods to his research, and an interest in the origins and challenges of trust in the creation and implementation of policy to his teaching and engagement work. Dr. Leslie joined the University of Calgary faculty in the autumn of 2016, arriving from the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine in Baltimore, MD. He was trained at the Universities of Toronto and Leicester where he held Canada Graduate and Trudeau Foundation Scholarships, and a post-doctoral position in patient safety and quality.
